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HISTORICAL NOTE

Between 1897 and 1930 the following individuals served as president of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology: James Mason Crafts, 1897-1900; Henry Smith Pritchett, 1900-1907; Arthur Amos Noyes, acting president, 1907-1909; Richard C. Maclaurin, 1909-1920; Ernest Fox Nichols, 1921; Elihu Thomson, acting president, 1922; and Samuel Wesley Stratton, 1923-1930.

SUMMARY

The collection documents the administration of MIT and the responsibilities and activities of the Institute's presidents between 1897 and 1930.

Correspondence, memoranda, and reports record activities of the MIT Corporation, including the Executive Committee and visiting committees. There is correspondence about the proposed merger with Harvard University in 1904 and a proposed alliance in 1911. The purchase of land in Cambridge, Mass., the planning and building of a new campus, and MIT's move from Boston to Cambridge in 1916 are well documented in correspondence with city officials, the architects and builders, as well as faculty. Reports and correspondence record the work of several committees, including the Administrative Committee and the Committee on Revision of the First and Second Years, 1929-1931. There is correspondence with faculty and department heads about appointments, curriculum, about scholarships, and prizes; with donors about gifts and bequests to the Institute; with other universities, professional organizations, and government offices including the United States Army and Navy, the Bureau of Standards, and the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics. An index of correspondence with personal names and those of institutions and organizations is included in the finding aid.

Box 32 was added in November 2006 and contains additional material related to the activities of Institute presidents between 1897 and 1930. The files have been integrated into the finding aid alphabetically.

Box 33 was added in July 2007 and includes, among other things, correspondence from MIT Chemistry Professor and Corporation member Edward Atkinson to Walker and a folder of invoices and correspondence regarding war supplies issued to MIT by the Commonwealth of Massachusetts in 1889. The folders (6 total) have been integrated into the finding aid alphabetically.
